### Learning Together, Growing Together

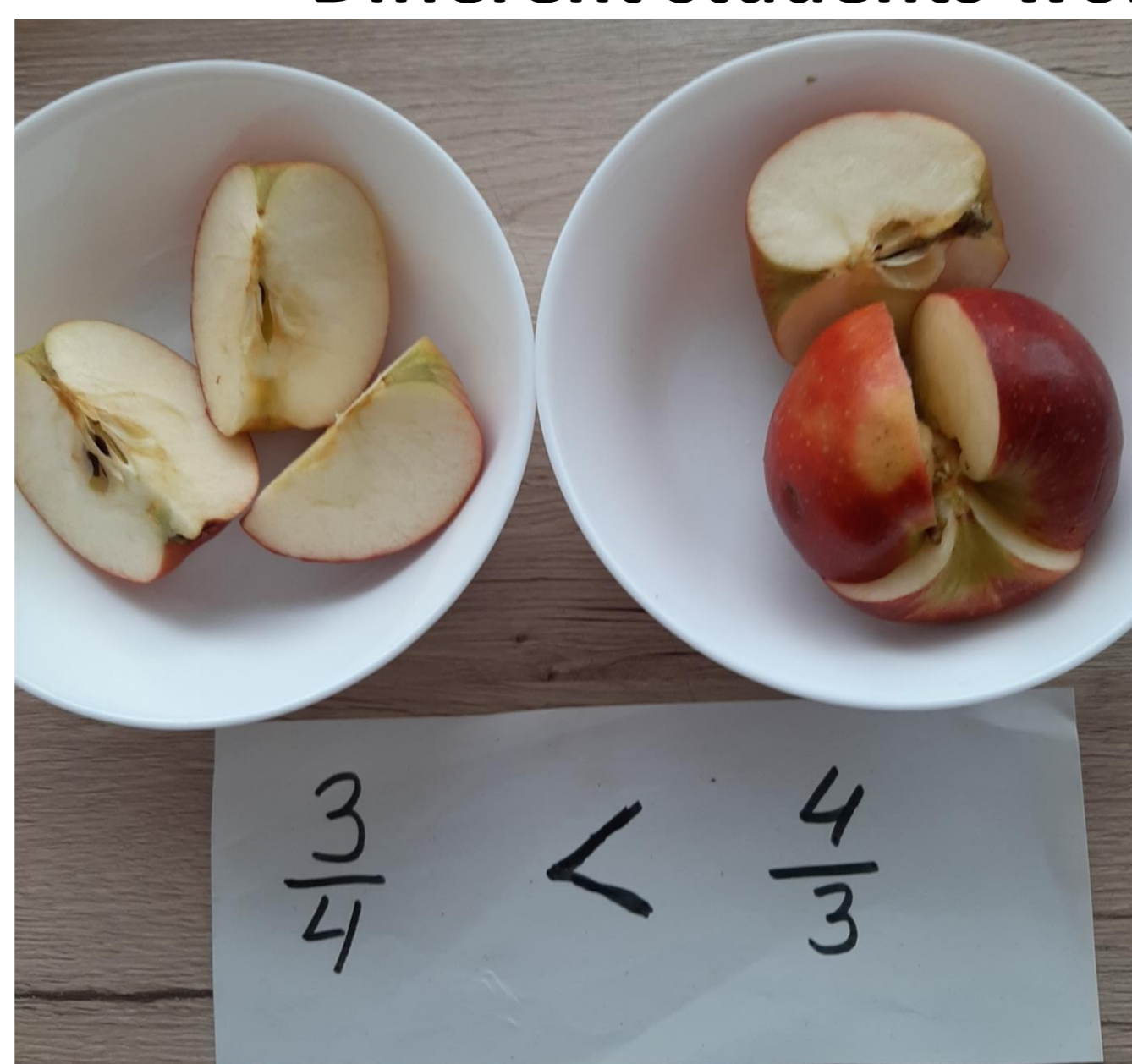
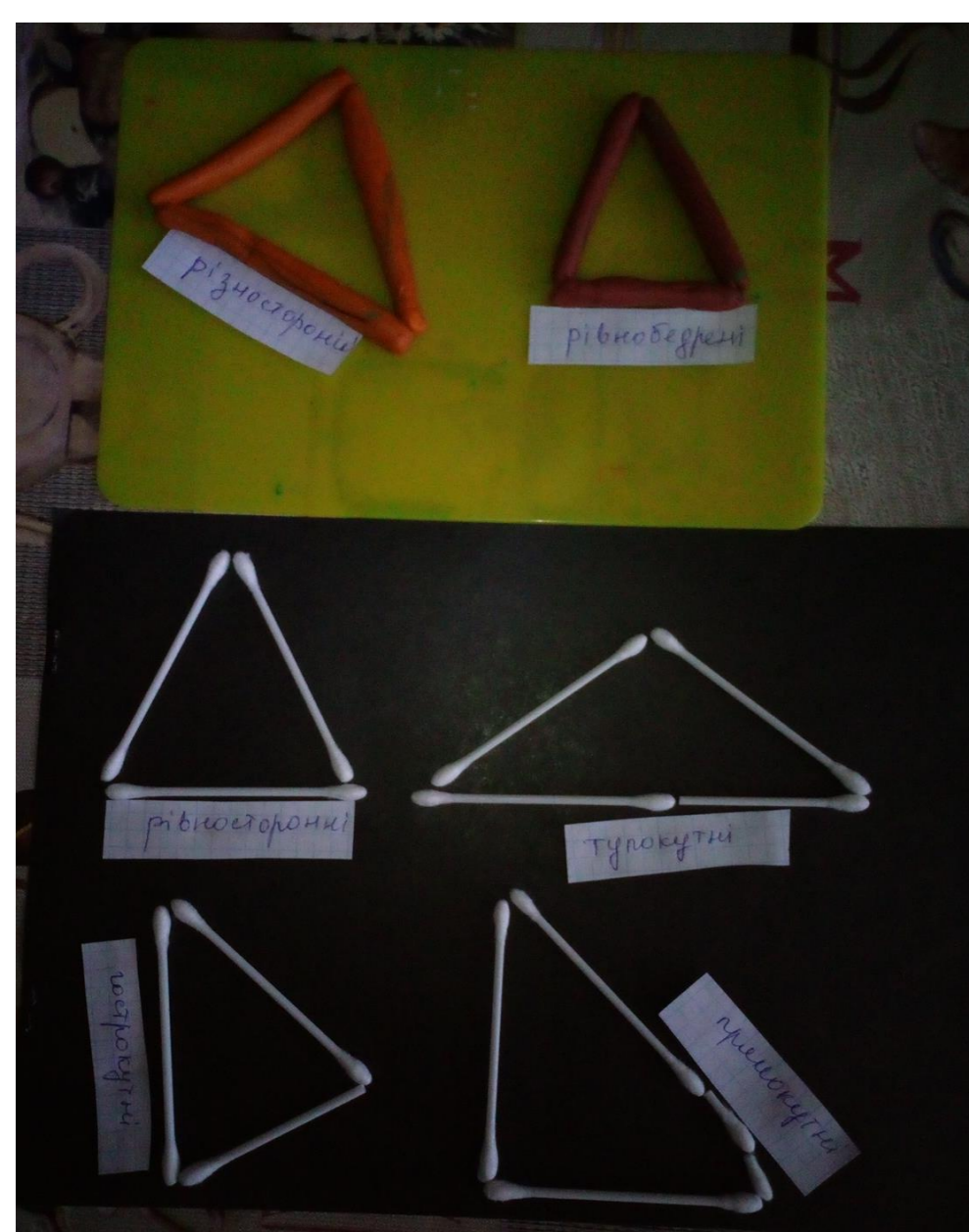


- The goal of this project was to enhance students' personal skills that they may need later in life.
- The focus was on organizing the work of **two student groups**: those with **normal development** and those with special educational needs (**SEN**).
- Students from Kazakhstan studied a school for gifted children, while Ukrainian students studied in a specialized school for SEN students.
- Initially, students from Kazakhstan were trained in basic methods and techniques for working with SEN students, ensuring emotional comfort for both groups.
- Subsequently, a series of educational materials on various topics were developed in collaboration with teachers for the SEN students.
